

## **MECHANISIM FOR ENSURING PLASTIC PROCESSING INDUSTRY'S CONTRIBUTION FOR WASTE MANAGEMENT**

There are lot of concern about ensuring proper management of plastic waste in the country. With the continuing growth of the plastic processing industry (as well as polymer producing majors) the use of plastics in various applications is bound to increase thereby generating higher quantum of waste to be disposed.

While proper collection, segregation & disposal of varieties of waste, including plastic waste, will be the primary responsibility of civic bodies, other stake holders like the general public & the processing industry must also contribute in this common effort.

Often question are asked how the processing industry can participate in this effort ?

In response to this quarry, AIPIA has given a suggestion to the Ministry of Environment & Forest, Govt. of India, for imposing an "environment cess" of Rs.100/- per ton on polymers. The Cess, so collected, will ultimately be paid by the entire plastic processing industry, thus confirming industry's participation in this common effort. Reckoning the current production of polymer at 6 million ton per year, annually a fund of Rs.60 crores will get generated at no extra cost for meeting the expenditure on various activities for proper management of plastic waste.

This Cess, collected by the major polymer producer, could be passed on monthly basis to Indian Centre for Plastic in the Environment (ICPE), Mumbai (- an autonomous body having representation from major polymer producers created under the orders of the MoEF). This body has membership from different industry associations across the country and has the requisite database & expertise for dealing with all issues relating to impact of plastics on the environment in general. For undertaking the activities indicated below, this body could be further strengthened with offices at other major metropolitan/capital cities for necessary coordination with civic bodies, plastic processing industry & related State Govt., apart from liaisoning with MoEF. ICPE could carry out the following task for effective management of plastic waste:

1. Educating general public against littering through print & visual media.
2. For undertaking awareness programs in association with MoEF and Civic Bodies etc. for promoting two bin culture across the country.
3. For extending subsidy for construction of kiosks by plastic processing industry for purchase & collection of used plastics.
4. For extending subsidy for encouraging scientific recycling of all type of plastic waste for producing alternate products etc. in major cities / towns.

The above proposition is a pragmatic one and should find acceptance at the decision making levels.

## **ASSOCIATION ACTIVITIES**

**Withdrawal of 4% additional duty (in lieu of VAT) on import**

## CHAIRMAN CBEC REMINDED

AIPIA has been suggesting to CBEC for withdrawal of 4% additional duty, imposed in lieu of VAT. Since the same in any case is refunded, AIPIA vide letter No. AIPIA/5/2010 dated 18/10/2010 reminded Chairman, CBEC for suitable action. Text of the letter is printed below:

“We wish to invite your kind attention to our letter No. AIPIA/5/2010 dated 07/09/2010 regarding the subject. A copy of the same is enclosed for ready reference.

As already stated in our above reference, additional duty of 4%, imposed in lieu of VAT, is ultimately refunded by the Custom Dept. to the trader after they submit requisite papers which need to be further examined by the Dept. before refund. This exercise involves avoidable paper work and considerable time to be spent both by the traders & the Dept. which really serves no purpose. Incidentally, there are rumors in the market that certain agencies are working for arranging expeditious refund for a consideration which does not speak well of the Dept.

If a levy is to be refunded later why it is imposed at all?

We would also request to CBEC to cause an audit of this aspect to ascertain what is the revenue earning for the Govt., if at all, from the time this levy is imposed. If the duty charged earlier is refunded later, it is revenue neutral but involves wastage of time both for the trade & Custom Dept.

Since apparently there are no revenue implications we again suggest that this levy may be withdrawn.

Even though, we have been representing for removal of this levy for the last 2/3 years, none of our references are being acknowledged or responded by CBEC.

Least we expect is that CBEC may give an acknowledgement to our reference in token of the fact that our suggestion is being considered favourably.”

## **Appointment of Regulator for Polymer Industry**

### **INTERVENTION OF CHIEF INFORMATION COMMISSION SOUGHT FOR RESPONSE BY DEPT. OF CHEMICALS & PETROCHEMICALS**

Not getting any suitable response from Dept. of Chemicals & Petrochemicals, Ministry of Chemicals & Fertilizers about AIPIA's suggestion for appointment of Regulator for polymer industry, intervention of Chief Information Commissioner was sought vide letter No. AIPIA/8/2010 dated 1<sup>st</sup> September 2010, text of the letter is printed below:

“This association has been representing to the Dept. of Chemicals & Petrochemicals, Union Ministry for Chemicals & Fertilizers, Govt. of India for the last several years for appointing a regulator for the Polymer Industry in order to inter alia discipline the polymer majors.

Not having received any response in reply to this association's representation, an application No. AIPIA/8/2010 dated 31/03/2010 under RTI was filed, copy of which is enclosed.

In reply to above application a perfunctory reply was received from Section Officer vide letter No. 46016/14/2010-PC-II dated 18/05/2010 (Copy enclosed).

Since the reply was given by the Section Officer on behalf of PIO, this association filed an appeal vide letter No. AIPIA/5/2010 dated 18<sup>th</sup> June 2010 to the Appellate Authority of Dept. of Chemicals & Petrochemicals, copy enclosed.

A response thereafter was received vide letter F. No. 46016/14/2010-PC-II dated 8<sup>th</sup> June 2010 of Dy. Director General & Appellate Authority, Dept. of Chemicals & Petrochemicals. (Copy attached).

As the reply received was not satisfactory, a further quarry was raised vide this association's letter No. AIPIA/5/2010 dated 31<sup>st</sup> July 2010 (Copy attached) addressed to Dy. Director General & Appellate Authority, Dept. of Chemicals & Petrochemicals.

Since, despite lapse of 30 days, no response / reply has been received from Dy. Director General & Appellate Authority, Dept. of Chemicals & Petrochemicals, we are constraint to put up this matter for your kind intervention, so that concerned Dept. is directed to give a specific reply to the quarries raised by us."

### **Confusion about jurisdiction of MCD/DJB about de-silting of rainy drains at Wazirpur Industrial Area**

## **Lt. Governor, Govt. of NCT of Delhi kept apprised**

Vide letter No. AIPIA/31/2010 dated 24/09/2010 AIPIA has apprised Lt. Governor about the confusion inter se DJB & MCD regarding the de-silting/cleaning of rainy drains & sewer lines of Wazirpur Industrial Area. Text of the letter is printed below:

"We enclose a copy of our letter of even number dated 16<sup>th</sup> September 2010 together with its enclosures addressed to Commissioner MCD, contents of which are self explicit.

You will kindly notice that there is utter confusion about jurisdiction in the matter of de-silting of rainy drains of Wazirpur Industrial Area, whereas PIO, Delhi Jal Board (DJB) intimated certain position which was not factual and we appealed against it to the Appellate Authority under RTI, DJB. While we were to attend the hearing, fixed by Appellate Authority under RTI, we received two letters No. EE(NW)III/2010-11 / 2276 dated 25/08/2010 & EE(NW)III/2009-10/2208 dated 27/08/2010 from Executive Engineer (NW)III, DJB, Ashok Vihar Delhi, which stated that de-silting of rainy drains was the responsibility of MCD and we should pursue the matter with MCD.

While we have taken up the matter with Commissioner MCD, as per the above letter, we bring this matter to your kind notice, with a request that you may kindly cause action so that there is clarity about the jurisdiction relating to the matter of de-silting of rainy drains and cleaning of sewer lines.

You will kindly agree that the current confusing position is resulting in no action in de-silting of rainy drains of Wazirpur Industrial Area ( particularly Block-A) . The rainy drains there, are being used as sewer lines with the result that since the same are not de-silted in one go, to save overflow and the sewerage water spreads out on the roads and even enters the premises of unit owners in the adjoining area. This is an unfortunate state of affair, for which there seems to be no accountability of any agency either MCD or DJB. As such, we request you for your kind intervention in sorting out this confusing situation so that de-silting of rainy drains is done in one go by whichever authority MCD/DJB.

We are sure, you will kindly take a note of the sad state of affairs in which the unit owners of Wazirpur Industrial (Block-A) are operating.

## **AIPIA Seek Lt. Governor Govt. of NCT's intervention to straighten matter**

Lt. Governor, Govt. of NCT of Delhi has been requested vide letter No. AIPIA/31/2010 dated 18<sup>th</sup> October 2010 to intervene to straighten matter relating to de-silting of rainy drains, sewer lines & linking of toilet blocks to sewer lines etc. Text of the letter is printed below:

“We invite kind attention to our earlier letter even number dated 24<sup>th</sup> September 2010 on the subject, a copy of which is enclosed for ready reference.

In response to our letter even number dated 16/09/2010 addressed to Commissioner, MCD, Executive Engineer, DJB has since clarified that de-silting of rainy drains is the responsibility of MCD. A copy of the response received from Executive Engineer, DJB vide letter No. EE(NW)III/2010-11/3803 dated 06/10/2010 is also enclosed for perusal.

We have suitably reacted to the Executive Engineer, DJB's above reference vide our letter dated 18<sup>th</sup> October 2010 (Copy enclosed raising certain basic points), which need to be attended by MCD/DJB in the interest of proper de-silting of rainy drains & sewer line of Wazirpur Industrial Area.

This apart, action is to be taken by MCD to connect the toilet block, constructed in Wazirpur Industrial Area, to the sewer lines instead of being connected to rainy drains as has been currently done. Due to this kind of action of MCD/DJB the rainy drains are getting utilized for:

1. Discharge of effluent from the adjoining units.
2. For discharge of sewerage also (apart from rain water).

The situation is such that sewer lines, which are separately laid, remain choked and rainy drains are getting used as sewer lines, thus overflowing on to the adjoining roads and such

overflow also enter the premises of some of the unit owners, particularly of Block-A, which is totally unacceptable.

You will kindly agree that rainy drains must be utilized as rainy drains only, for discharge of accumulated rain water, and not for any other purpose.

We are addressing this letter to Your Excellency with the fond hope that you will kindly take specific interest in this massy situation for directing MCD/DJB for taking following action in order to make the life of unit owners of Wazirpur Industrial Area less taxing than is the current experience:

1. MCD should forthwith connect the Toilet Block constructed in Wazirpur Industrial Area to sewer lines (as against their being connected to rainy drains).
2. If de-silting of rainy drains is the responsibility of MCD than it should take action for de-silting of rainy drains in planned manner preferably in one go.
3. Sewer lines which are lying choked should be immediately de-silted / cleaned by DJB as the same is reported to be their responsibility.
4. As the matter is of public interest and this situation has been obtaining for the last several years same needs to be immediately corrected by specific action suggested above.

We trust you will kindly intervene and direct the concerned MCD/DJB officials to take required corrective measures on priority.”

#### **De-silting of rainy drains by MCD etc.**

### **AIPIA reacts to clarification of Executive Engineer, Delhi Jal Board**

Reacting to clarification received from Executive Engineer, Delhi Jal Board vide his letter No.EE(NW)III/2010-11 dated 06/10/2010 contents of which is given below :

“Reference to your letter No. AIPIA/31/2010 dated 16/09/2010, as requested, it is clarified that rainy drains are to be de-silted by MCD whereas DJB is responsible for cleaning of sewer line. As regards to Toilet blocks, the same are under the jurisdiction of MCD.”

AIPIA has written letter No. AIPIA/31/2010 dated 18/10/2010 to Executive Engineer, Delhi Jal Board, text of which is printed below, copies of the letters were also endorsed to Lt. Governor & Chief Minister, Govt. Of NCT of Delhi beside Secretary, Delhi Jal Board:

“This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter No. EE(NW)III/2010-11/3803 dated 06/10/2010 on the subject contents of which are noted with surprise if not amusement.

We also note that our letter even No. dated 16/09/2010 addressed to Commissioner, MCD was inter alia endorsed to Secretary, Delhi Jal Board for causing clarification. Apparently you are responding to this endorsement.

In this connection we wish to raise the following points:

1. If DJB is responsible for de-silting of sewer lines how did PIO, DJB reply vide letter No. /F-35/CE(WEST)/PIO/10/5334 dated 28/09/2010 to our RTI query dated 26/07/2010 covering the matter of de-silting of rainy drains particularly of Block –A of Wazirpur Industrial area?
2. If rainy drains are to be de-silted by MCD why did that Appellate Authority, DJB held a hearing on 14/09/2010 which was attended by DJB Engineer and who was directed to give further report after a survey within seven days? This report has been received by us vide PIO, DJB's above letter dated 28/09/2010 giving specific details of de-silting of rainy drains done by DJB of certain blocks to which we have raised further query vide our RTI application dated 01/10/2010 for which we await a reply from PIO, DJB.
3. We have been pointing out for the last several years both to MCD & DJB that rainy drains are being used as sewer lines apart from discharge of effluent from factories located alongside. We have been emphasizing that rainy drains should only be used for the purpose of discharge of accumulated rain water and not as sewer lines.

Since the rainy drains are being used as sewer lines, how did DJB undertake de-silting of the same as de-silting of rainy drains is the responsibility of the MCD (as confirmed by your letter under reference) and de-silting of sewer lines is the responsibility of DJB. Can DJB or MCD explain as to how and why rainy drains are being used as sewer lines also?

It has also been reported by our member that the sewer lines of block A continue to remain choked which are not being de-silted by DJB. Kindly advise reason there for?

It is also brought to the notice of MCD in our separate reference that toilet block constructed in Wazirpur Industrial Area are connected to rainy drains and not to sewer lines which is peculiar. Who will take the required action to connect the toilet block to sewer lines (and not to rainy drains)? Can DJB throw any light on this aspect?

We find that situation as obtaining in Wazirpur Industrial Area for the last 30-40 year is a messy one for which both MCD & DJB should be held accountable. Remedial measures to improve matter is the need of the hour and initiative must be taken, both by MCD & DJB, to spend tax-payers money for de-silting work etc.

As the entire matter require urgent and serious attention, we are endorsing a copy of this communication to Commissioner, MCD for his information and for causing required necessary action in coordination with DJB to ensure that :

1. Rainy drains are used only as rainy drains and nothing else.
2. That Sewer lines, currently lying choked, de-silted/cleaned by DJB since this work falls in their jurisdiction.

We are also, endorsing copy of this letter to Lt. Governor as well as to Chief Minister, Government of NCT of Delhi for their information & urgent intervention.”

**POINTS DISCUSSED DURING THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (2009-11) MEETING  
HELD ON 11<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2010**

**1. Report on hearing held by Appellate Authority, Delhi Jal Board on 14/09/2010:**

The information given by the representative of the PIO, DJB was incorrect and this was pointed out to the authority. The matter is being followed further.

**2. Report on hearing held by CAT on 16/09/2010 in Gail India matter:**

It was informed that a point has been raised that the affidavit now submitted by this association has not been signed by the same person who has signed the association's original complaint. It was clarified that since association has periodic elections, the current affidavit was signed on behalf of the association by the Hony. General Secretary. Further the complaint was made by the association and not by any individual. The matter will be pursued further. The next date of hearing has been fixed for 16/11/2010.

**3. Acquiring programme for sending bulk SMS etc. and to identify authentic source of information that could be shared with members:**

The proposition of acquiring the programme was approved. It was decided to send 100,000 SMS in next three years to association members on weekly / fortnightly basis covering the following:

- Information regarding international polymer price trend will be conveyed in respect of PP, HDPE, LDPE & LLDPE grades every Monday.
- Information regarding any significant development affecting polymer market will also be conveyed.
- SMS reminders for attending monthly meeting will be sent to executive committee members & office bearers.

Interested members will be required to pay a token amount of Rs.100/- per annum for availing this facility.

**4. Briefing members about funds sanctioned by Ministry of MSME for up-gradation of association's facilities provided database is prepared about members as per prescribed pro-forma:**

The efforts put in for obtaining sanction was lauded. For availing the amount sanctioned, which is 50% of the expenses i.e. Rs. 1,40,000/-, information from the members has to be regularly collected and sent to the authorities on six monthly basis. Whether the association can take responsibility for submitting this data regularly is a matter to be debated further.

**5. Apprising members about progress of Writ Petition & SLPs filed in the Supreme Court of India:**

Members were apprised of the position. A stay petition is planned to be filed for restraining Govt. of NCT which has virtually banned all kind of plastic bags.

**6. Review availability position of raw material and pricing aspect:**

It was noted that though crude prices were showing upward trend, prices of polymer in the market are showing stability. Stronger rupee & good availability may be the reason.
